The Lebanon Rescue Mission Men's Shelter offers food, clothing and other life essentials to men in need of temporary shelter. For those dedicated to making lasting and permanent change, our nine-month residential Men's Program, centered on building a personal relationship with Christ, offers addiction recovery, life- and job-skills training, financial management and goal setting.

The Lebanon Free Clinic provides primary medical care—including wellness checks and acute- and chronic-illness management—to residents of Lebanon County who are uninsured or underinsured and can't afford the cost of treatments or prescriptions on their own. Area physicians, nurses, mental-health professionals and specialists volunteer their time to see patients at the clinic or in their own offices.

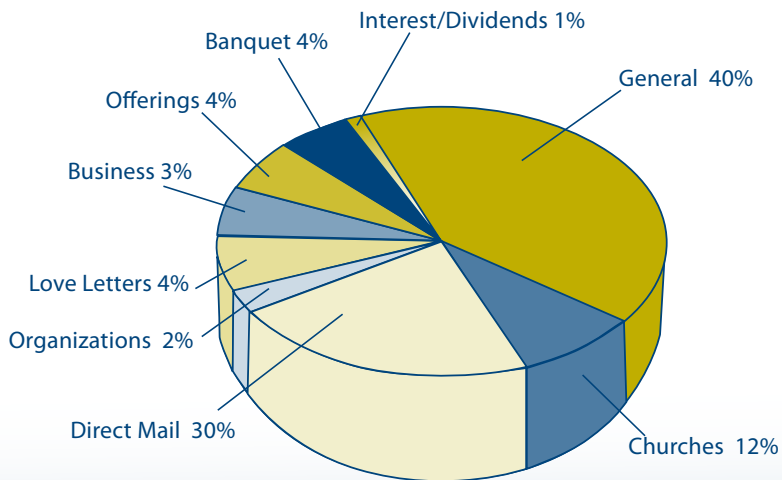


Our Mission Statement

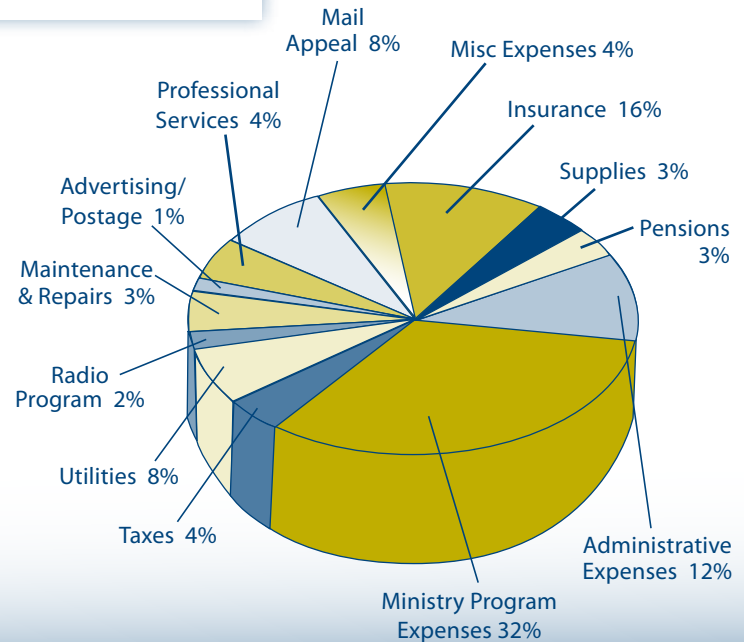
To represent and present the gospel of Jesus Christ to all within our sphere of influence and to alleviate human suffering, in His name, without discrimination.
